**How GP Clinical Update Works:**

Updates will be researched by GPST1, GPST2 & GPST3 and supported by the GP Trainer. The GPST in **bold** and marked with an asterisk will lead on the topic. There will be a case-based discussion and, with relevant specialty Consultants, the latest evidence based and NICE guidelines will be shared. Topics will cover the RCGP Curriculum and all 12 competences needed for GP Revalidation. We encourage all GP Trainees giving presentations to map their topic to the RCGP Curriculum Statements, in particular the learning outcomes. Please see the RCGP website ([www.rcgp.org.uk](http://www.rcgp.org.uk)) for further details.

The competences which form the framework for WPBA are derived from the first Curriculum Statement, 'Being a GP' and are set out below:

- Communication & Consultation Skills (communication with patients and the use of recognised consultation techniques)
- Practising Holistically (operating in physical, psychological, socioeconomic and cultural dimensions, taking into account feelings as well as thoughts)
- Data Gathering & Interpretation (clinical judgement, choice of physical examination and investigations and their interpretation)
- Making a Diagnosis & Making Decisions (a conscious, structured approach to decision making)
- Clinical Management (recognition and management of common medical conditions in Primary Care)
- Maintaining Medical Competency & Promoting Health (aspects of care beyond managing straightforward problems, including management of co-morbidity, uncertainty, risk and focusing on health rather than just illness)
- Organisation, Management & Leadership (an understanding of the use of computer systems to augment the GP consultation and Primary Care at individual and systems levels, the management of change and the development of organisational and clinical leadership skills)
- Working with Colleagues & in Teams (working effectively with other professionals to ensure good patient care, including sharing information with colleagues)
- Community Orientation (management of the health and social care of the practice population and local community)
- Maintaining Performance, Learning & Teaching (maintaining performance and effective CPD for oneself and others)
- Maintaining an Ethical Approach to Practice (practising ethically, with integrity and a respect for diversity)
- Fitness to Practise (the doctor's awareness of when his/her own performance, conduct or health, or that of others, might put patients at risk and taking action to protect patients)
- Clinical Examination & Procedural Skills (competent physical examination of the patient with accurate interpretation of physical signs and the safe practice of procedural skills)
